The Primary Section has enjoyed a busy and rewarding third term filled with learning and memorable experiences.

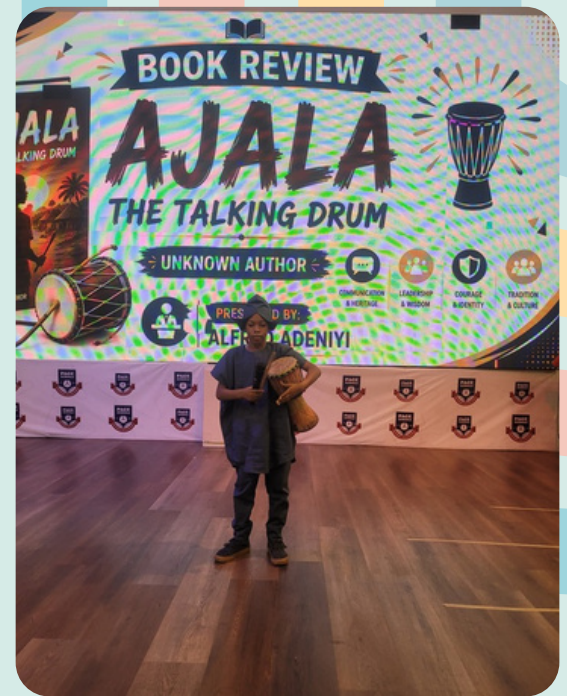
A key highlight was the Year 6 Transition Tour, where pupils visited the Secondary Section to familiarise themselves with the next stage of their educational journey.

Our Children's Day celebration at Marshall Hall was filled with excitement and laughter.

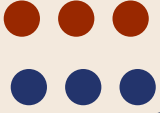
